The following was announced on September 10, 2010 by the International Air Transportation Division, Civil Aviation Bureau Ministry of Land Infrastructure Transport and Tourism

> Regulations changed to facilitate the convenient use of Tokyo International Airport (RJTT/HND) for Business Jets.

As of October 31, 2010, Tokyo International Airport will be more widely available for international flights. In addition, the regulations will be changed in order to promote the use of business jets and to greatly improve the convenience for business jet users. The changes are as follows.

- 1. Slots become available for international business jet flights during the daytime. (between 2100 UTC/0600 LCL and 1359 UTC/2259 LCL)
- 2. The number of available slots for business jets during the daytime increases up to Twelve (12). *Arrival slots and departure slots count separately. (If the aircraft arrives and departs on the same day, it counts as two slots.) Both international and domestic flights are eligible for the expanded number of slots.
- 3. The parking period for business jets increases up to 7 days.
- 4. The 7- day- prior- application deadline for business jet flights is reduced to 0 days. (i.e. can apply the day of operation)
- 5. The length of time and distance between terminal and dis/embarking spot has been shortened. (The dis/embarking spots for business jets will be secured near the new international terminal.)

In addition, the application deadline for charter permits for foreign registered business jets will be changed. The application will be accepted by MLIT no later than 24 hours prior to an operation in case of urgent business matters or unavoidable situations.

The use of business jets has been expanding worldwide, especially in the US and Europe recently. It is essential for Japan to improve the environment for business jets in order to maintain its position as a global economic center and to implement its economic growth strategy.

There have been reports to the MLIT conference that "In order for the Tokyo metropolitan airport to play a leading role in Japan's economic growth, it is necessary to take drastic measures to reinforce its functions. This includes: to strengthen the international and domestic flight network, to improve the convenience of international and domestic transit, to accommodate the needs of low cost carriers and business jets.

Taking these situations into account, it has been decided to change the regulations to facilitate the use of business jets and improve the convenience for business jet users at Tokyo International Airport. These regulation changes will be in effect as of October 31, 2010 when international airline service begins as the new runway opens.

In accordance with the changes, as of October 31, processing charter permit applications for international operation of foreign registered aircraft will be changed. Previously charter permit applications had to be submitted to MLIT 3 days prior to the operation date. Under the new rule, applications can be submitted as short as 24 hours prior to arrival or departure time in the case of urgent business matters or unavoidable situations.
